Bradley M. M. Bewkes is an award-winning technologist, former elected public official, and entrepreneur. He currently holds the position of Director of Business Development for <u>Idealist</u>, a nonprofit technology platform where 150,000 organizations and businesses around the world post social-impact job, internship, and volunteer opportunities. Bradley serves on several tech advisory boards within CUNY, the public university system of New York City, and also serves on the board of Opportunity to Restore, part of Operation Restoration, a nonprofit dedicated to supporting women and girls impacted by incarceration. In addition, Bradley is a Manhattan landlord, controlling a

corner building on 64th & Lexington.

Previously, he held elected office in Stamford, Connecticut, on the Board of Representatives.
